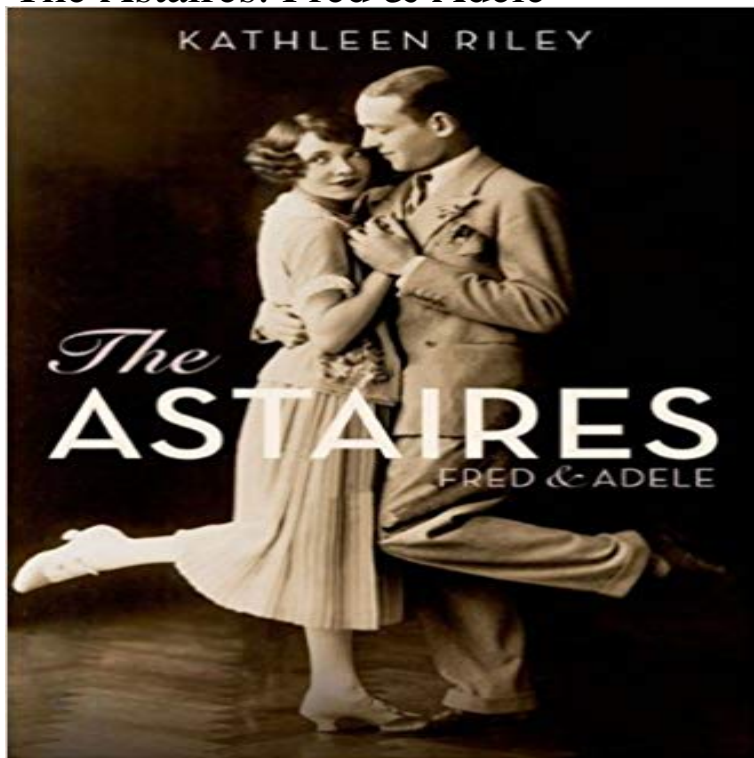


The Astaires: Fred & Adele
