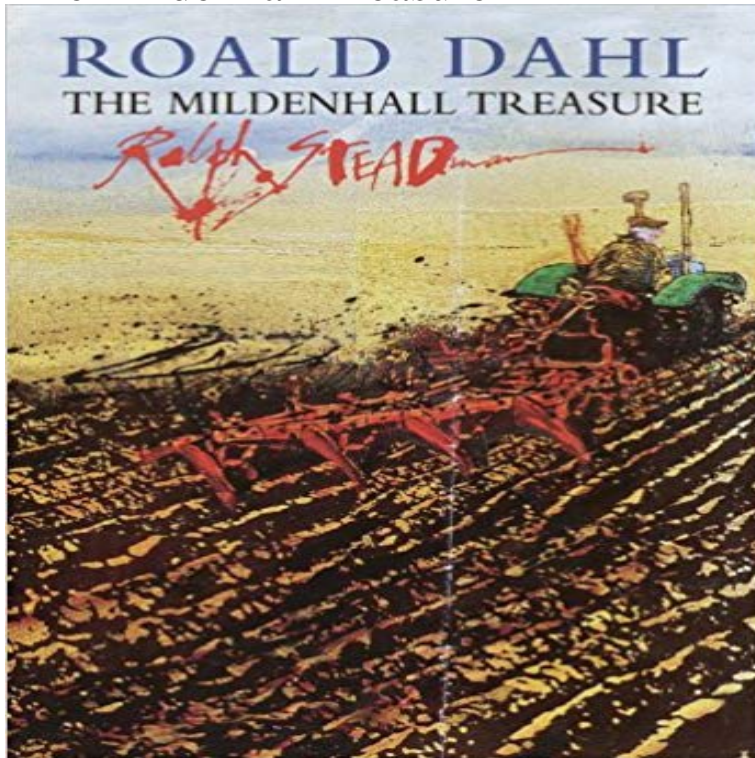


The Mildenhall Treasure

The 34 pieces of silver were discovered after the war by the authorities and taken to the British Museum, where they reside today.
